Headlice

This week, we have more reports of headlice. The following guidance is for parents to check their child for lice.

If live lice are found, parents should treat their child and others in close contact but there is no need to keep the child out of school.

Detection and Treatment:

- Regular Checks:

Parents should check their child's hair regularly, ideally once a week, using a nit comb.

- Live Lice:

The presence of live, moving lice is the only way to confirm head lice infestation.

- Treatment:

Treat head lice as soon as live lice are spotted.

- Family Check:

Check all members of the household and any close contacts to ensure everyone is treated if needed.

- Wet Combing:

Wet combing can be effective for removing lice and nits. This involves washing hair, applying conditioner, and using a special nit comb to remove lice and nits, repeating the process on days 1, 5, 9, and 13.

- Other Treatments:

Medicated lotions and sprays are also available from pharmacies and supermarkets.

- Follow Instructions:

Always follow the instructions on the treatment product and consult with a pharmacy for advice.

- Repeat Treatment:

Some treatments may require a second application after a week to kill any newly hatched lice.

Prevention and Other Tips:

- No Need to Stay Home: Children with head lice do not need to be kept out of school.
- Avoid Head-to-Head Contact: Encourage children to avoid head-to-head contact with others while at school.
- Regular Washing: Regular shampooing and conditioning can help prevent head lice.
- No Need for Extreme Measures: There is no need to wash laundry on hot washes or take other extreme measures.
- Consult Professionals: If you have concerns or questions about head lice, consult with a pharmacist or your GP for advice.
